Pain on eating
Or nausea and vomiting after meals



Upper back pain



Upper Abdominal pain



Unexplained weight loss



Dark urine



Fatigue



Indigestion



New onset diabetes

Not associated with weight gain



Jaundice

Yellowing of skin and eyes



Pale and smelly stools that don't flush easily
